Kekaha FCU Joining Aloha Pacific FCU Ohana November 1

Beginning November 1, 2018, Kekaha FCU will become part of the Aloha Pacific FCU ohana in a special "co-branded" merger. Kekaha will then be known as Kekaha Credit Union, a Division of Aloha Pacific Federal Credit Union, maintaining its identity while giving our members full access to all the products and services APFCU offers.

Members of Kekaha FCU voted in favor of the merger through online and mail-in voting that ended in July.

- A website, kekahacu.com. Until then, you can continue to go to kekahafcu.org, but beginning November 1 you will be automatically redirected to the new website.
- A newly redesigned logo.

- A new debit card. If you have a Kekaha FCU debit card, a

- Surcharge-free access to First Hawaiian Bank, American Savings Bank, Hawaii National Bank and Bank of Nevada ATMs. These banks will never charge you a fee, but after the first five transactions per month at these and other non-APFCU ATMs, there is a \$1 fee per transaction.
- As part of the Aloha Pacific FCU ohana, you will receive the Kalaline newsletter (we say aloha to Kui Ka Lono with this issue).

APFCU was chartered in 1936 by a dozen Honolulu City & County workers who gathered together to create a financial institution to assist their fellow workers. It was originally named Honolulu City & County Employees Federal Credit Union but in 2007 changed its name to the more inclusive Aloha Pacific FCU. Today, APFCU has a diverse membership that includes more than 2,000 Select Employee Groups.

APFCU is based in Honolulu and is the only Hawaii financial



institution with a branch in Las Vegas, in the Henderson community.

Kekaha FCU will be the third co-branded merger for APFCU.

Its first was last year, with Hawaii National Guard FCU, and another co-branded merger was recently completed with OTS Employees FCU.

International Credit Union Day, October 18

Each year credit unions celebrate International Credit Union Day and on the third Thursday of October.

The theme for this year's October 18 event is "Find Your Platinum Lining in Credit Unions," marking the 70th (platinum) anniversary of International Credit Union Day.

Credit unions all over the world will be celebrating the history and the success of the "people, not profit" philosophy. This year's theme emphasizes the credit union movement's loyalty to its members and its mission to provide them financial support and guidance.

The movement began in the



1840s as a democratic consumer cooperative by weavers in Rochdale, England. Frustrated by bankers who denied them loans simply because they weren't wealthy, the weavers and workers decided to pool their incomes

and loan money to each other. In time, this cooperation put each member on solid financial ground and encouraged their own businesses to flourish.

The need for equitable financial institutions grew and, in 1971, the World Council of Credit Unions, Inc. was created to help establish and maintain viable credit union movements. It has become the leading voice for advocacy

and governance on behalf of the international credit union community.

Today, more than 235 million people are served by credit unions in 109 countries and 6 continents.

Be Cyber Safe on Your Mobile Device

October is National Cyber Security Awareness Month, which aims to educate consumers about staying safe online.

Many of us rely on our mobile devices, so here are a few basic safety tips:

- Secure your devices with strong, unique passwords.
- Or use biometric security, which authenticates an individual's identity through physical traits and lets you sign in to your accounts without filling out your credentials.

Beginning November 1, Kekaha FCU members will have access to Aloha Pacific FCU's free mobile app, which includes Touch ID for iPhone/iPad and Fingerprint ID for Android phones. Such security features lock your device if it's lost or stolen and prevent others from seeing your passwords.

 Beware of public WiFi hotspots that are not secure. When using such hotspots, don't log in to your email or



your financial accounts. Use a VPN (virtual private network) or your own personal hotspot instead.

 Keep your devices and apps updated. The latest versions of web browsers and apps often have updated security and protection against viruses. Delete the apps you no longer use.
